Update to Temporary Telehealth Billing

Hi all – We received updated guidance issued regarding MassHealth and Telehealth billing. Below is the updated information as given to us.

Telehealth Triage Visits: 99441, 99442, 99443

This category will change to, "Telehealth Triage," on the E&M Code Button.

All of these visits are only valid in the following cases:

- 1) Phone Call Triage.
- 2) <u>Not as Follow-Up</u> to a visit 7 days prior, related to the subject of the current call.
- 3) <u>Does Not</u> lead to a visit within 24 hours.
- 4) Must be an established patient. We must have a medical history with them.

This is not a full MassHealth Visit, and is consider a brief phone triage.

Telehealth Virtual Visit: 99211 VV and 99212 VV

This is considered the equivalent of a full face to face visit, and is subject to the discretion of the rendering provider. The test for whether we can bill this for MassHealth is the following:


- 1) Was it a billable MassHealth visit and paid before?
- 2) Is it clinically appropriate to be delivered via telehealth?
- 3) Are you conforming with the documenting guidelines in Appendix A (see internal website https://scchc.org/wp-content/uploads/2020/03/Appendix-A.pdf)
- 4) Is it medically necessary for the member?

If you answer yes to these four questions, then the visit will be paid by MassHealth or and MCO at the rate previously paid.


Because there are specific documentation requirements, we have created a template entitled, "*Telehealth Virtual Visit*," with standard documentation and billing code, as well as a new E&M Category titled: "*Telehealth Virtual Visit*," with the codes, "99211 VV and 99212 VV."
